

## “TWO PRODUCTIVE STILLWATER PATTERNS FROM THE 2014 SEASON”



A marabou and schlappen streamer that provided exciting fall fishing for browns and rainbows. The above picture shows the streamer wet.

This is a very simple and easy fly that just catches fish! Easily adapted to a desired color scheme. Lightweight, casts easily.

Thanks to Bill Black and Spirit River for providing the UV2 materials.



This is a heavy hook version of the pattern introduced in Wes's 2010 Bend Workshop. New tying techniques demo. Recommended heavy artillery for the damsel nymph season! This is an intermediate level tying project, and you will learn a lot about new materials and techniques.

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Hook: Mustad 3366 #2 or equivalent

Thread: White 6/0 or Monocord

Weight: 4-5 wraps of .030 lead

Tail: White Spirit River UV2 Marabou

Tail Flash: Green-hued Pearl Flashabou

Body: Green-hued Pearl Cactus Chenille

Back: Olive Spirit River UV2 Marabou

Hackle: White Spirit River UV2 Schlappen

Below: a color variation using root beer cactus chenille, olive back, and root beer tail flash.



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Hook: Daiichi 1150 #12 (up eye, 1XH, 2XS scud hook - preferred)

Thread: Light Cahill 6/0 or Monocord

Wingcase Thread: Coats Transparent Polyester (see notes on next page)

Tail: Arctic Fox body hair, dyed Rusty Olive, Olive or two-tone (as shown in photo) We will be doing an all-Olive in the class

Tail Flash: Red Fluoro Fiber

Thorax: Hareline STS Trilobal Damsel Green sheathed with soft fur fuzz taken from tail.

Legs: Hareline STS Trilobal Damsel Green picked out from thorax

Eyes: Copper ball-chain 2mm-2.4mm, also gold and other colors

Wingcase: Clear beading cord covered with UV Knotsense or Liquid Fusion polyurethane.

THREADS (Note that we will have threads available for use if you do not have your own. After class, purchase sources for all materials will be listed through links on FlyFoundry.com.)

- <sup>a</sup> **Suggested threads (ALL WHITE) for the Old-School Streamer:**  
white 6/0, or Danville Monocord (preferred, but a discontinued product), or Veevus 240 denier
- <sup>a</sup> **Suggested threads (LIGHT CAHILL) for the Juicebug Damsel Nymph:**  
light cahill 6/0, or Pale Yellow Danville Monocord (preferred, but discontinued product).
- <sup>a</sup> **Clear thread for tying the wingcase of the Juicebug Damsel Nymph:**  
Coats Transparent Polyester. Bring yours if you already have it, otherwise, there will thread available for use in class. Best place to buy this locally (under \$3) is Michaels.

BRING YOUR TYING VISE, NORMAL TOOLS AND CEMENTS

## BRING THESE ITEMS IF YOU HAVE THEM

(will make the class go smoother – we will have extras for class use)

- Second Bobbin Holder
- Bodkin or needle
- Small tube of super glue (2-for-\$1 at Dollar Tree)
- Small Wire Cutter for cutting ball chain
- UV Flashlight and UV Knotsense or equivalent
- Small bottle of Alcohol Hand Cleaner gel
